PENTECOST TERM SUMMER COURSE



An intensive one-week Pentecost Term summer course entitled "*The Liturgy as Lens: God, Community and the Self*" (PT604) will be taught by visiting professor the Rt. Rev. Keith L. Ackerman, Eighth Bishop of Quincy (IL) and President of Forward In Faith North America. The course will span the week of August 13 to 17, 2012, starting at 9 AM Monday.

Bishop Ackerman and his wife Joann co-wrote the primary textbook for the class, *To God Be the Glory*, about what you need to know to run a healthy congregation. This is an excellent course for current Master of Divinity students as well as alumni and clergy seeking continuing education. The cost of the three credit course is \$495 for tuition or \$175 for course audit.
